Eamcet candidates shouldn't apply mehandi

The candidates appearing for AP Eamcet 2018 should not decorate their hands with mehandi, tattoos, paintings or other colours just before the approach of the the examinations.

Such candidates would not be allowed to give the examination. The candidates also should not take wrist watches, smart watches, watch boxes, calculators, mobile phones or any other electronic equipment along with them.

The examination time will be fixed in the com-

puters as the Eamcet will be conducted online for the second time. Hall-tickets, Eamcet applications and caste certificates in the case of Schedule Castes and Schedule Tribes are required.

Eamcet convener Ch. Saibabu, said the candidates would be allowed into the examination centre after taking biometric attendance. He said the candidates should be sufficiently proficient about using computers and also writing the examination online.

Sources said that as many as 34,000 students can

be allowed for each session for the engineering stream and 38,000 for agriculture and medicine.

The Eamcet office selected the examination centres at Srikakulam, Rajam, Tekkali, Vizianagar, Bobbili, Visakhapatnam, Anandapuram, Gajuwaka, Anakapalli, Kakinada, Rajahmundry, Amalapuram, Eluru, Bhimavaram, Tadepalligudem, Narasapuram, Vijayawada, Mylavaram, Kanchikacherla, Machilipatnam, Gudlavalleru, Guntur, Narasaraopet, Bapatla, Ongole, Markapuram, Chirala, Nellore, Kavali, Guduru,

Chittoor, Puttoor, Tirupati, Madanapalli, Kadapa, Proddatur, Rajampet, Anantapur, Gutti, Hindupur, Puttaparthi, Kurnool and Nandyal in Andhra Pradesh and in Hyderabad, L.B. Nagar, Nacharam and Secuderabad.

The Eamcet-2018 chairman and in-charge Vice Chancellor of JNTUK, S. Ramakrishna Rao, said that the candidates can download the hall tickets from April 18. However, the candidates can still apply for the exam with a fine of ₹5,000 up to April 16 and a fine of ₹10,000 up to April 21.
